Indentured Servant

Williamsburg

Indentured servant whose contract was bought by William Hunter (230) in 1752.

Chaddock's sole association with the American print trade comes from the record of his indenture being purchased by William Hunter, who then conducted the only press in Virginia, in 1752. That record does not indicate how Hunter employed Chaddock, but as the transaction was recorded in his daily business journal, it is evident that Chaddock worked in the Williamsburg printing office, though his function remains unknown. His fate is also uncertain; he likely was the Thomas Chaddock who was later paid for his service as a private in the military expedition led by George Washington that was dispatched to the Ohio country in the summer of 1754; but any further record of his life has not been found.
