Title: The speech of the Honourable Francis Fauquier Esq.; His Majesty's lieutenant-governor, and commander in chief, of the colony and dominion of Virginia: to the General Assembly, summoned to be held at the capitol, in the city of Williamsburg, on Thursday the Fourteenth day of September in the Thirty-second year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord, George II. by the grace of God, of Great-Britain, France and Ireland, King. Defender of the Faith &c. &c. and in the year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred and fifty-eight.

Notes: Address of the resident governor opening the Assembly session, setting out the legislative priorities of the imperial administration, delivered on September 14, 1758. Here Fauquier proposed a series of measures for defending the frontier following the expected victory of a British expeditionary force in the Ohio country led by Gen. John Forbes – whose assault on Fort Duquesne was repulsed by the French this same day.

Hunter was in England from June 1756 to July 1759; his office's production was handled by John Stretch during his absence.
