Notes: Official proclamation lacking imprint statement; Alexander Purdie was acting as the public printer in July 1766 following the death of Joseph Royle in January 1766; John Dixon became a partner in June 1766; Purdie was not succeeded in the role until November 1766, when William Rind was elected in his place.
