Notes: Signed in print: "A Virginian Born and Bred." Author argues for eliminating the plantation agriculture of Virginia, including the enslavement of Africans to make it work, and a system of government that favors slave holders over other citizens. Given controversial nature of content, it is unsurprising that this imprint lacks any identified printer or place; yet subject matter and focus indicate a Virginia origin. Shipton & Mooney attributed title to James Hay.
