Notes: Petition seeks establishment of public warehouses for flour, just as the state had built for tobacco; dated at end in manuscript "Dec. 11, 1797" by a clerk of the House of Delegates, indicating date of submission.

Only known copy is held in the state archives at the Library of Virginia, but the location of the petitioners is not recorded in the library's catalogue.

Sheet lacks printer credit; clearly a Virginia imprint, but assigning a printer is speculative.
