Notes: Herein, the committee exhorts the county committees to assure the maximum turnout of voters favorable to Adams & Pinckney in the forthcoming election as the only way to prevent a Republican victory.

Sheet lacks printer credit; while clearly issued in Richmond, the press producing this circular is unnamed; however, by late September 1800, the only Federalist printer operating in the state capital was that of Augustine Davis, so the attribution here.
