Notes: Copy not seen; whether this circular defended or assailed Burr is unclear from cataloguing records that report only the physical characteristics of the imprint, and not its content. This item antedates Burr's indictment and trial in Richmond, but after his arrest in the Mississippi Territory on the order of President Jefferson.

Only known copy, held by the Duke University Library, lacks colophon; Hummel ascribed this item to a Virginia press, even as date line indicates Washington, so its inclusion here. If a Virginia imprint, it was likely issued in Alexandria.
