Publication Data: December 19, 1799 to June 12, 1800 Weekly

Proprietors: Lyon & Field

IVP Associates: James Lyon (274), Thomas Field (162)

Notes: One of four periodicals edited by Lyon in support of Republicans, esp. Jefferson, in the 1800 elections; each journal was conducted by a resident printer-proprietor, here Field.

Variant 02: The Republican

Publication Data: June 19, 1800 to December 1800 2/week (Mon, Thurs)

Proprietors: Lyon & Field

IVP Associates: James Lyon (274), Thomas Field (162)

Notes: With issue of June 19, 1800, Lyon & Field increased pace of production from weekly to twice-weekly, matching that of its Federalist competitor, the *Petersburg Intelligencer*.

Variant 03: The Republican

Publication Data: December 1800 to July 1, 1802 2/week (Mon, Thurs)

Proprietors: Thomas Field

IVP Associates: Thomas Field (162)

Notes: During 1800, Lyon withdrew from firms issuing all of his partisan journals; his Petersburg alliance with Field ended sometime that December. Field continued alone until October 1805. Financial issues obliged his reorganization of the paper in summer 1802, requiring a suspension after July 1st until September 30th.

Variant 04: The Republican & Petersburg Advertiser

Publication Data: September 30, 1802 to December 21, 1802 2/week (Tues, Fri)

Proprietors: Thomas Field

IVP Associates: Thomas Field (162)

Notes: Publication resumed on September 30 1802, after a thirteen-week suspension wherein Field reorganized his business financially; revived paper appeared with expanded title.

Variant 05: Petersburg Republican

Publication Data: December 24, 1802 to March 26, 1805 2/week (Tues, Fri)

Notes: Simple title alteration with issue of December 24, 1802.

Publication Data: March 29, 1805 to October 18, 1805 2/week (Tues, Fri)

Notes: Simple title alteration with issue of March 29, 1805.

Variant 07: The Republican

Publication Data: October 21, 1805 to March 29, 1816 2/week (Tues, Fri)

Proprietors: Edward Pescud

IVP Associates: Edward Pescud (324), William Winston Seaton (373)

Notes: Following issue of October 18, 1805, Field sold his paper to Pescud, one of the proprietors of the competing *Petersburg Intelligencer*; Pescud continued paper until 1831.

Variant 08: Petersburg Republican

Publication Data: April 2, 1816 to October 16, 1827 2/week (Tues, Fri)

Proprietors: Edward Pescud

IVP Associates: Edward Pescud (324)

Notes: Simple title alteration with issue of April 2, 1816. Fiscal issues forced Pescud to reorganize paper following issue of October 16, 1827; publication suspended until October 27, 1827, when paper reappeared under a new title.

Variant 08: The Old Dominion

Publication Data: October 27, 1827 to about January 29, 1831 2/week (Wed, Sat)

Proprietors: Edward Pescud

IVP Associates: Edward Pescud (324)

Notes: Publication of Pescud's paper resumed October 27, 1827, following a fiscal reorganization, under the new title seen here; Pescud was appointed collector of the port of Petersburg in mid-January 1831, so leading to the closing of his paper about January 29, 1831.
