Variant 01: The Recorder or Lady's and Gentleman's Miscellany

Publication Data: July 11, 1801 to after January 30, 1802 Weekly (Sat)

Proprietors: Henry Pace

IVP Associates: Henry Pace (319)

Notes: English émigré Pace commenced publishing Richmond's first literary weekly in July 1801, about one year after his arrival; omitted publication of January 23, 1802, issue for want of help at end of Assembly session; sometime in three weeks following January 30 issue, he took Callender in as editorial-partner, so transforming paper into partisan journal.

Variant 02: The Recorder or Lady's and Gentleman's Miscellany

Publication Data: By February 27, 1802 to October 27, 1802 Weekly (Sat > Wed)

Proprietors: Pace & Callender

IVP Associates: Henry Pace (319); James Thomson Callender (075)

Notes: Sometime between January 30 and February 27, 1802, Pace took Callender in as editorial-partner, transforming his literary weekly into a partisan journal; however, paper retained its original title, until end of October 1802. Sometime in spring 1802, likely in April, day of publication changed from Saturday to Wednesday.

Variant 03: The Recorder

Publication Data: November 3, 1802 to after February 23, 1803 Weekly (Wed)

Proprietors: Pace & Callender

IVP Associates: Henry Pace (319); James Thomson Callender (075)

Notes: With issue of November 3, 1802, title shortened to reflect change in editorial focus from literary to partisan content effected preceding February; firm commenced twice-weekly publication sometime between issues of February 23 and March 12, 1803, probably with issue of March 2nd, which marked start of Callender's second year with Pace.

Variant 04: The Recorder

Publication Data: By March 12, 1803 to June 15, 1803 2/week (Wed, Sat)

Proprietors: Pace & Callender

IVP Associates: Henry Pace (319); James Thomson Callender (075)

Notes: Sometime between issues of February 23 and March 12, 1803, partners increased pace of publication to twice-weekly; in "mid-June," partnership was dissolved by Pace in response to Callender's drinking, which had kept him away from their office "for eight weeks."

Variante 05: The Recorder

Publication Data: June 18, 1803 to August 24, 1803 2/week (Wed, Sat)

Proprietors: Henry Pace

IVP Associates: Henry Pace (319)

Notes: Pace dissolved partnership with Callender in "mid-June" because of Callender's behavior; he continued as sole proprietor of paper until its closure with issue of August 24, 1803.
