Copy of this edition at the Library of Virginia is bound with 1751 edition of John Tennent's *Every Man His Own Doctor* (1751.001); the copy of that imprint at the American Antiquarian Society is bound with the 1742 edition of Smith's *Compleat Housewife* (1742.001); the two variant binding-states suggest Hunter disposed of unsold sheets of that 1742 edition still in Parks' estate (d. May 1750) by adding a new edition of Tennent to the mix; his success in marketing that pairing in 1751 instigated publication of this new edition of Smith's work in 1752 in order to continue the profitable bound offering.
