Title: To the freeholders of the counties of Gloucester, Middlesex, Essex, King and Queen, King William, Caroline, Westmoreland, Richmond, Northumberland, and Lancaster: [from] Woodbury, in Richmond County. Gentlemen, When I offer myself, as a candidate to represent you in the general Congress of the United States, I think it proper to declare the principles, which shall govern my conduct, if I have the honour of being elected. ...

Notes: Signed in print by Lee; he was then campaigning for election to the First Congress on a platform supporting the various amendments to the Constitution proposed by the Virginia Ratification Convention; he was unsuccessful in this effort, despite being a younger brother of the revolutionary leader Richard Henry Lee (1732-94).
