After his release from the Richmond jail for his June 1800 seditious libel conviction for his polemical *The Prospect Before Us* (1800.019), Callender fell out with Jefferson and Virginia's Republican leaders over their refusal to compensate him for his imprisonment with public offices and/or financial subsidies; these letters were part of his initial contributions to Pace's struggling *Recorder* in early to mid-1801; herein, Callender attacked his former partner in partisan publishing, then public printer Meriwether Jones, over his "self-interested" conduct of that office and of his semi-official newspaper *The Examiner*.
