Cabell in April, concerning jurisdictional and procedural issues in the criminal cases of Isaac Compton (for burglary) and George Keesler, alias Joseph Hibber (for horse theft), who had broken out of jail in Winchester (Frederick County) for crimes committed in Berkeley County.
